How you get there

- 1 High school diploma** Grade 12
Grade 12 math, physics and chemistry. This trade is more academic than most.
- 2 College diploma (optional but common)** 2 years
A 2-year Instrumentation Engineering Technology or Instrumentation and Control diploma. In Alberta the diploma can count toward apprenticeship periods.
- 3 Get hired and register** Weeks to months
Refineries, oil sands operators, utilities, water plants and industrial contractors hire apprentices. Register with Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training, Skilled Trades Ontario or your provincial authority.
- 4 Work and study** 3 to 4 years
About 6,000 hours in Alberta (4 periods of roughly 1,500 hours plus 8 to 10 weeks of school each) or 8,000 hours in Ontario, covering process control, electronics, calibration and PLCs (programmable logic controllers).
- 5 Certificate of Qualification and Red Seal** After your hours
Pass the provincial exam and add the interprovincial Red Seal.

Pros and cons

- + One of the highest-paid trades in Canada
- + More thinking, less lifting than most trades
- + Skills move between oil, mining, water, food and nuclear
- Best jobs are in remote or industrial places, not big cities
- Camp rotations are hard on relationships
- Chemical, pressure and gas hazards on site

Optional boosts

Dual ticket with electrician. PLC (programmable logic controller) and DCS (distributed control system) programming. Safety instrumented systems training. Analyzer specialist.

Good to know

The signal that is never zero

Most industrial sensors send a 4 to 20 milliamp signal. The scale starts at 4, not 0, so a reading of zero means a broken wire, not an empty tank. That idea has been keeping plants safe since the 1950s.
