How you get there

- 1 High school diploma** Grade 12
History, geography, drama and any language. Being comfortable speaking to a group matters more than marks.
- 2 Apply for a season** Winter before
Tour companies, museums, parks and historic sites hire for summer in the winter before, often January to March. Apply early.
- 3 Company training** 1 to 3 weeks
One to three weeks learning the route, the script, the safety plan and how to handle a group of 40 people who all want the washroom.
- 4 Work a season, then another** 1 to 3 seasons
Guides are rehired on reputation. Two good seasons gets you lead guide and first pick of tours.
- 5 Specialize or go year round** Year 2 onward
Multi-day tours, a second language, cruise ship shore excursions, or a guiding business of your own.

Pros and cons

- + Hired with no schooling and no debt
- + You work outside and meet people from everywhere
- + Tips can lift the pay well above the posted rate
- Seasonal, so the winter income problem is real
- Weather decides your day and your tips
- Talking for six hours a day is more tiring than it sounds
